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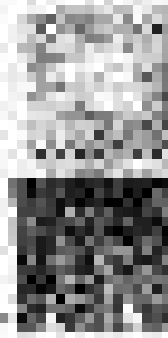

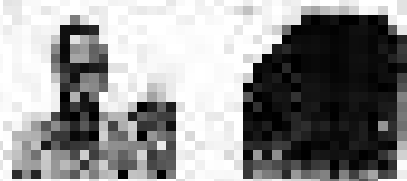


Figure 1: A photograph of a person sitting at a desk, possibly a healthcare professional, with a computer monitor visible in the background.

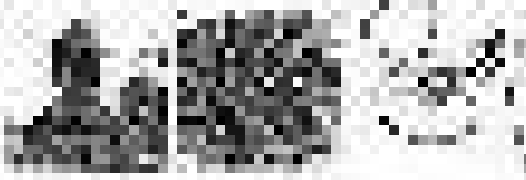


Figure 5: A photograph of a person sitting at a desk, possibly a healthcare professional, with a computer monitor visible in the background.

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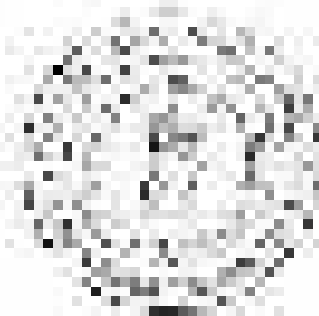
